

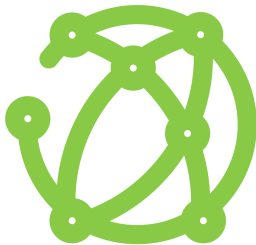

ABOUT THE FORUM

The [Schools2030 Global Forum](#) is an annual event that brings together diverse education stakeholders – International Organisations, Teachers and School Leaders, Civil Society Partners, Researchers, Donors, Ministries of Education and District-level Education Authorities – to discuss how to raise learning outcomes, improve the quality of teaching and strengthen education systems around the globe. The Global Forum takes place in June of each year, bringing 200+ international delegates together and lasting 3-4 days in length.

Each year, the Schools2030 Global Forum is hosted in a different country, allowing the [Aga Khan Foundation](#) (AKF) and our partners to celebrate and amplify the educational achievements and priorities of the host country.

In June 2023, the Global Forum will be held in Portugal, co-hosted by AKF, the Aga Khan Development Network (AKDN), the Government of Portugal and the Municipality of Porto. The theme of this year's Global Forum is Educational Equity and Inclusion, focusing on the question: **How might we foster more inclusive schools and more pluralistic learning societies by 2030?**

We will once again bring 200+ international delegates together to dialogue on how we can improve educational opportunities for all children and young people, and to highlight the priorities and achievements of Portugal in this area.
